
Letter from Executive Director, David Aichele

ON MAY 1, 2023, the boundaries of the Downtown Investment District were expanded to include areas around S. Prince and W. Vine Streets and the 200 Block of W. King Street. Business owners and residents in these new sections will now benefit from our supplemental cleaning services, weeding, and mulching of tree wells. Ambassadors will now also patrol the areas, providing an extra set of eyes and ears to help improve quality of life.

We are also proud to share that our Downtown Investment District Outreach Specialist has been hard at work connecting with vulnerable individuals on the street. Her work to build relationships and be a trusted resource may take days, weeks, or even months, but since January 2023, she has interacted with over 500 individuals. In the past 18 months, almost 60 individuals have accepted some level of shelter or housing and another 30 individuals have accepted help into a rehabilitation facility to deal with an addiction issue.

We are committed to maintaining a clean and safe environment for our businesses, residents, and visitors. To respond to the changing needs within the downtown, and in partnership with the City of Lancaster and Lancaster County Housing and Redevelopment Authority, we are implementing a holistic approach to address the community's concerns for anyone enjoying the City's public spaces. This approach will focus on four pillars that contribute to successful public spaces. They are: Security, Services, Programming, and Communications. Our work in these areas will be demonstrated throughout this newsletter, and we encourage our readers to use and enjoy the City's public spaces.

In closing, summer is an exciting time in the City, and I hope you take advantage of the opportunities to celebrate. Check out our list of new businesses in the DID on page 5 and be sure to take the opportunity to support them. Clean Team working collaboratively with City on Fix It! App

Binns Park/Ewell Plaza

THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT to refresh Binns Park continues. The metal façade around the stage area will be scrapped and repainted, cement work will repair the area around the fountain, electrical work will be completed, and new lighting will be installed. Binns Park should be reopening mid-September for everyone to use.

Here is what is happening around Binns Park and Ewell Plaza to assist both the vulnerable individuals residing in this area as well as supporting the businesses owners, residents, property owners, and others in close proximity to the park and plaza.

Downtown Investment District Ambassadors continue to increase patrols in Ewell Plaza. Their work supports individuals in need, ensures a clean space for the public, and provides an extra set of eyes and ears to enhance safety in the plaza.

 Clean Team Ambassadors (blue shirt) patrols Ewell Plaza from 9AM to 8PM, seven days a week.

The team wipes down tables and chairs, picks up litter, cleans and monitors the public bathrooms, empties trash cans, and reports suspicious behavior.

 Downtown Investment District Homeless Outreach Specialist spends a minimum of six hours in the plaza, interacting with individuals in need of social services and housing.

Since January 2023, our outreach specialist has connected with 522 individuals and worked with 52 individuals by the month of May. Examples of referrals include homeless outreach, persons with disabilities, substance abuse services, employment, health services, rent relief, food access, laundry connection, shower access, clothing, and transportation.

During the evening hours, a red shirt ambassador spends two to three hours on and off patrolling the plaza. Additionally, stakeholders in the area are meeting regularly to enhance communications so the DID, police, property owners, service providers, and merchants can address issues together.

Homelessness Outreach in Downtown Helps Our Most Vulnerable Communities

THE DOWNTOWN INVESTMENT DISTRICT OUTREACH SPECIALIST has

made great progress referring unsheltered community members to shelter and rehabilitative services, reporting nearly 500 unique interactions with individuals since January 2023. In the past 18 months, almost 60 individuals have accepted some level of shelter or housing and another 30 individuals have accepted help into a rehabilitation facility for addiction treatment.

The work of the Outreach Specialist is critical to improving the quality of life for our most

vulnerable population while also improving conditions for our downtown businesses and residents. In our survey last year of DID property owners, we learned that stakeholders wanted to expand the coverage of the Outreach Specialists from the current five days a week to seven. Because of this, we are exploring grant opportunities for the role's expansion to provide for additional homeless outreach in the DID.

Lancaster County Convention Center Summer Event Attendance Soars
