Letter from Executive Director, David Aichele

IT IS WINTER in the City and the Downtown Investment District Clean Team and Ambassadors are out and about seven days a week, ready to serve. When snow falls, their focus is to keep the curb cuts clear and safe for pedestrians. Property owners are responsible for clearing the sidewalks, but the squad will keep a watchful eye on the changing conditions of the curbs, removing accumulated snow and ice and applying ice melt, as needed.

The Street Outreach Specialist continues her patrols through the winter months to help ensure individuals on the street have access to shelter. This includes the Lancaster County Food Hub Emergency Shelter at 232 N. Prince Street. The shelter moved to this temporary space in November 2023. It was formally located at Ebenezer Baptist Church. The emergency shelter is open from 9PM-7PM, seven days a week and as a temporary space, will only be open through April 2024. We hope you were able to enjoy the new art markets at Ewell Plaza and 100 N. Queen during the holidays. Next up will be the sidewalk string lights to keep the festive atmosphere going. It takes vision, coordination, and hard work by many to make these projects come to reality, so I encourage you to take the time to experience it all.

Binns Park/Ewell Plaza

Overnight Security Guard Pilot Program Extended



AT THE SEPTEMBER

Downtown Investment District Board of Directors meeting, the Board agreed to pilot an Overnight Security guard service in the DID. The security guard, contracted through Schaad Detective Agency, concentrates their walking patrols in the downtown core including areas around Binns Park and Ewell Plaza, between the hours of 6PM-2AM, Wednesday through Sunday. During the trial period, the guard made connections with

nearby restaurants, bars, and individuals experiencing homelessness, serving as an extra set of eyes and ears in the Downtown Investment District. The Lancaster City Police, businesses owners, and individuals all shared positive feedback on the presence of the security guard.

At the November meeting the DID Board reviewed the program and decided to continue the security guard service through April 30, 2024, which is the end of the DID fiscal year.


Bravo Regina!

Beautiful New Mural on Orange Street

HAVE YOU SEEN the delightful new mural at 38 W. Orange Street? Completed by Aron Rook, the mural was the vision of Andre and Donna Pham, owners of Issei Noddle. Andre and Donna wanted to incorporate imagery that represented Andre's Okinawan/Japanese and Vietnamese heritage.

"Growing up as Asian American kids in a small town, we both grew accustomed to masking our cultures and identities to fit in with our peers. It is a common theme of childhood that all children of immigrant parents are probably familiar with. But we never really understood the toll that would take on our lives until we opened the ramen shop and then ultimately began to have kids of our own. The lesson that we, and so many other Asian Americans who are navigating through parenthood just like us, are striving to teach our kids as they grow up is this: you don't have to hide. You can fully embrace all the aspects of your multicultural family culture. You can enjoy sharing the food that we love to eat even if it looks different and smells different and tastes different from everybody else's food. All of the things that brought shame or embarrassment to us when we were kids can now be worn like badges of honor for our kids." said Donna Pham.

The mural will soon complement the new home of Issei Noodle coming to 38 W. Orange Street in the first quarter of 2024. Along with the new mural, Issei Noodle



will now offer a full-service bar and the Japanese Izakaya concept, which features small plates and snacks.
