Lancaster County Homelessness Coalition Programs and Resources

Coordinated Entry

- Provides a common, single point of entry into the network of homeless services.

Street Outreach

- Seeks out those who are unsheltered/sleeping rough and provides information and basic resources like *Mobile Hygiene Unit Refresh Lancaster*

Emergency/Winter/ Extreme Weather Shelters & Day Centers

- Provides a safe, warm, dry place to sleep and point of connection to engage with service providers.

Housing Programs

- Crisis housing, short-term rental assistance, and long-term housing supports for individuals and families experiencing homelessness.

Homelessness Prevention

- Assists households in maintaining their home to prevent eviction and homelessness.





The national Point-in-Time count is an actual count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January.

The 2025 PIT Count was the 2nd highest since 2022 and occurred during the coldest night of the year with a temperature of -4 degrees.

The Point-in-Time Count:


- Congressionally mandated – a national effort to count people experiencing homelessness on a single night each January.
- Assists communities understand how many people are living in shelters or without a safe place to stay especially during the coldest time of the year.
- It only captures **one night**, and we know the number is underrepresented and changes throughout the year.
- Many people move in / out of unstable housing, so this count is just one way we try to understand the need and advocate for the right resources to help.

Beyond collecting numbers, the Count can also be a meaningful opportunity to connect with individuals and families who are often the hardest to reach and may not engage with the system.

DATA TRENDS: 2009 - 2025

HUD-reported Point in Time Count totals 2009-2025*



Since 2017 we have seen steady increases in the number of individuals experiencing homelessness.

Since 2021 Lancaster county has seen a 51.52% increase in the number of individuals captured by the PIT data.

In 2022, there was a 11% increase, followed by 2023 with a 13.5% increase

While we saw a decrease in 2025, the trend is approaching the levels of the 2009 recession.

Opened on December 30, 2024, and hosted at Otterbein United Methodist Church, CSES provides 85 beds as the city's first permanent, year-round, low-barrier emergency shelter since 2009. Through operational services provided by YMCA of the Roses, the shelter offers vulnerable adults a safe, warm, and welcoming place to sleep every night.
